BEACH SUNFLOWER / DUNE SUNFLOWER

Helianthus debilis

- The Beach sunflower is a native plant in the Aster family and blooms year-round.
- This is a true "sun" flower, in that the flower faces the rising sun and follows it across the sky throughout the day.
- This plant helps hold the soil in place on the dunes and is a nice plant to cultivate in landscapes for ground cover or border.
- Notice the flower's brown eye. This plant attracts butterflies and has been recognized by pollination ecologists as attracting large numbers of native bees.
- Native Americans ground seeds to make a "meal" for cooking and a peanut butter-like finger food.
 Dyes were made from petals.
- If purchasing at nursery, make sure you are getting the Helianthus debilis and not Wedelia, as it has been sold by some nurseries purporting it as beach or dune sunflowers. Wedelia is an exotic species that is highly invasive.
